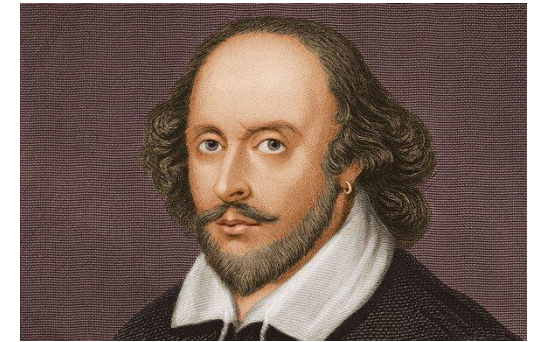


The popular British children's writer. Eleanor wrote poems, short stories and novellas, parables and miracle plays. She is famous for her fairy tales for children and satirical short stories for adults.

The first book "Children's songs old London" was published in 1916. In 1956, by the decision of International Board on Books for Young People UNESCO (IBBY) E. Farjeon became the first winner of the Hans Christian Andersen.

Also she liked to cook, take care of the flowers, besides managing to grow 127 kittens.

Robert Burns was born on January 25, 1759 in the village of Alloway (Ayrshire), in a peasant family. Since 1783, Robert began to write poetry. In 1786 he published the first book of Burns, Poems, Chiefly in the Scottish dialect («Poems Chiefly in the Scottish dialect»). For the initial period of creativity also include: "John Barleycorn» (John Barleycorn, 1782), «Jolly Beggars» («The Jolly Beggars», 1785), "The prayer of St. Wylie» («Holy Willie's Prayer»), «The Holy Fair ' («The Holy Fair», 1786). The poet is rapidly becoming known throughout Scotland.



William Shakespeare is one of the greatest and most famous writers in the world. He was born in 1564 in Stratford-on-Avon.

At that time actors and actresses visited Stratford-on-Avon. William liked to watch them. He was fond of their profession and he decided to become an actor.

He went to London. There he became an actor. He began to write plays too. Shakespeare was both an actor and a playwright. In his works Shakespeare described the most important and dramatic events in life.
